Double Tile Bangle

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ABOUT THE CZECHMATES OUADRATILE:

The low profile thickness and flat surface area make the QuadraTile a universal component that adds structural integrity and connectivity without bulk. It's a great base plate for arches and foundations in dimensional designs.

MATERIALS

- 24 CzechMates® QuadraTile (QT)
- 24 CzechMates® Tile, Color 1 (CT1)
- 24 CzechMates® Tile, Color 2 (CT2)

TOHO One-G Thread

Thread Wax

Creates 7" bangle. For a bigger bangle, increase by four CzechMates Tile.






INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Put a needle on 6ft of thread, double over and wax well.
- 2. Pick up QT, CT1, QT, CT2, and repeat until 24 pairs of QT and CT are strung on. Form a loop by tying the ends in a square knot. Pass through a few beads and exit a CT2.
- To reverse direction, jump through the open hole of the current CT2. Pass into an open hole of the adjacent QT, pulling the CT2 up 'flat'.
- 4. Add CT1, allowing it to dangle next to the adjacent CT1, then pass through the corresponding open hole on the next QT. Pass through the second (open) hole of the next CT2, pulling it up to sit flat, then pass through the next QT. Repeat adding CT1s and passing through CT2s for the entire bangle.



To reverse direction, pass through the first CT1 added in this step, the next QT, then jump down diagonally through an open hole of the QT.





- 6. Flip the piece over. Pass through the open hole of the adjacent CT1, and the corresponding open hole of the next QT, securing the CT1 in to place. Add CT2, then pass through the corresponding open hole of the next QT. Repeat adding CT2s and passing through CT1s for the entire bangle.
- To reverse direction, jump through the open second hole of a CT2 added in this step, then pass through the remaining open hole of the adjacent QT.
- For the final round, pass through all remaining open holes, securing all CTs in to place. If your piece needs more tension, continue passing around the ring, pulling tight as you go. To tie off with a few half-hitch knots, passing through a few beads between knots, before trimming the ends.
